



On August 6, within the framework of the SOLACI-SOCIME 2025 Congress, the XV ProEducar-SOLACI Fellows Course was held. This was the 15th consecutive edition, which continues to grow in importance and relevance within each congress.

As is characteristic of the Course, sessions were dedicated to practical training, tips and tricks, and step-by-step approaches to complex interventions.

The first session focused on vascular access, covering topics from the proper performance of a radial approach to step-by-step management of large vessels and percutaneous closure systems. This was followed by a master lecture by Dr. Mauro Echavarría Pinto (MEX) and Dr. Héctor García-García (USA) on the use of physiology and intravascular imaging—tools that should be increasingly used as they optimize interventional outcomes.

The Course also featured special sessions such as the “Techniques Review by Experts,” including left main coronary interventions by Dr. José María Hernández (ESP), calcified lesions with Dr. Neisser Morales (MEX), reperfusion in acute myocardial infarction by Dr. Jorge Chavarría (CR), in-stent restenosis treatment by Dr. Ricardo Costa (BR), and the distinguished participation of Dr. Goran Stankovic (SER), one of the world leaders in bifurcation interventions.

Afternoon sessions focused on structural heart disease, with the presence of Dr. Flavio Ribichini (ITA), Dr. Pedro Villablanca (USA), and Dr. Juan Alonso Briaes (ESP), who summarized all aspects of percutaneous aortic valve treatment. This was complemented by discussions on left atrial appendage closure, tricuspid valve interventions, and acute pulmonary embolism.

Interaction with fellows was very active throughout the course, particularly highlighted during the Lunch Session, where the four best clinical cases submitted by fellows were presented.

We successfully concluded another Course with outstanding results. We thank the speakers and the SOLACI and Congress authorities for their unwavering support. At the same time, we continue to pave the way to accompany and train SOLACI fellows, with the expectation of moving forward together.
